# **Senior Employment Center**

A new way to staff your day shift

Recently, I interviewed Rose Marie Zamary, from the Youngstown office, of the Senior Employment Center. This is a federally funded program to find jobs for people that are 55 years and older. I spoke to the Youngstown office; they post jobs for clients that are in the program. They usually have 100 or so looking for average skill jobs at any one time. Many are looking for part-time work. Some do seek full time work. Many of the frequent placements have been in fast food, janitorial, dietary, and similar areas.

The numbers of Job postings in the Youngstown area are in the 30-40 range. There is no pre –screening, although if Senior Employment sees a perfect fit between client and employer they will call their client right away and help set up an interview.

You are not obligated to hire or keep their client. They will also pay up to 12 weeks of train-

ing; fast food usually fits into the 4-5 week range of wages being paid. Then, you are required to put them on your payroll. Rose Marie, Senior Employment, says that they have a lot of clients that just "want to work"; they have nice skills and would do a nice job. She follows that up with the fact that not all clients would be a good fit for fast food.

This employment center is not to be used as a "stop-gap" program. Hiring just to fill a few weeks of vacation time is not what this program is intended to do. If you are interested in trying to become an employer, there is a small application you will fill out. There are no fees to become a job site. Senior Employment exists in over 36 counties in Ohio and 5 counties in Western Pa. You can call the 1-800-472-8961 to find out if this program exists in your county. It is always good to find a new way to staff our front counter, especially at NO COST!

# **Health Insurance Update**

GBA and Bev Cline have worked many hours on this health insurance program. The first quotes that came out were NOT the savings that had been projected for our membership. So, GBA went back to the drawing board and has figured out a way to **increase the** savings that was minimal in the beginning. This past week, GBA has requested a rate relief from Anthem; I can report the following in regards to the program.

About 20 Dairy Queens will be signing up to take advantage of the savings. The savings for the North Lima Dairy Queen alone will be almost \$200 per month, which is about \$2400 per year. Another operator will be saving about \$280 per month, and even bigger savings is coming to a larger group at over \$2,400 per month, resulting in a total savings of \$28,000 per year. I am encouraged at these numbers because health insurance is such a huge concern to our membership. GBA has put in countless hours to accomplish this savings. If you have questions you can call Bev Cline at GBA-216-468-2100. This program is currently only available In Ohio.

Total estimated savings for the entire block of DQ'sif all of the applicants take advantage of the health insurance proposal our membership will save approximately, \$7,425 per month which is over \$89,000 per year.

GBA is interested in West Virginia if the DQ operators express enough interest.

## **Mix Program**

We have had another increase in our mix program through NESO; our current mix price is \$3.43 for vanilla. Reminder, you do receive a \$.03 per gallon rebate if you are a current NESO and DQOA member. Many of the other dairies/distributors have artificially lowered their prices to try and splinter our mix program. Our mix price is based on a formula, the mix price can only be lowered or increased based on the federal buying guidelines for milk solids and butterfat. The mix price for the other suppliers changes with the wind and what the market will bare. Just 3 short years ago Ohio had one of the highest prices for mix in the country, and now we have one of the cheapest mix prices only second to the Arizona group, which had formed the first mix co-op in the country. The other mix suppliers love it when one DQ drops out and another starts complaining, because they know if our Mix Co-op ends they can raise the mix price, just as quickly as they lowered it! Don't be naïve and think they don't watch our program very closely, you can support the mix program or help in its demise, your purchases show your lovalty!

Next rebate checks will not be issued until October.

## **DQOA PRODUCT UPDATED**

Tray liners will be shipped to the warehouses very shortly. DQOA is very close on several other products as well. I should have several more items by the next newsletter.

Don't forget the Crown Select "Summer Bull's-eye Promotion" Rebate on Hot Fudge, Chocolate Cone Coating, Cocoa Fudge, Cold Fudge, Caramel, and Butterscotch Topping. The rebate applies to purchases from July 1,2005 to September 30<sup>th</sup> 2005. If you have extra room for storage take advantage of this rebate program!

## **Tricks of the Trade**

- ⇒ A medium fry container portions the tortilla chip to the 1-1.5oz weight for the new chili lime chicken. Make sure you put the powder in the bottom of the bowl, if you sprinkle the spice on top of the chicken it clumps.
- ⇒ At a recent DMA meeting- some operators talked about putting milk in an extra deep topping well instead of the gallon container and then pumping it out with the vanilla pump. Some stores do not have room for the milk dispenser so this would be a good alternative to keep the milk cold for shake preparation. The deep well will hold over 2 quarts of milk. Good idea for a second topping rail, too.
- ⇒ Trent Rapp, Canfield Dairy Queen, Ohio uses a kitchen timer to remind his employees to check the mix and clean the front counters. The kitchen timer is set for 30 minutes, when it goes off, one employee drops what ever they are doing, then checks the mixes. Another employee wipes down the front counter. Even when they are busy, they use the kitchen timer. The employees seem to really enjoy it as well. Thanks Trent, it sounds like it is worth a try!
