First DataVisa and Master Card processing

Each Newsletter I must continue to tell the operators about this program. Next year all locations will be required to have some sort of credit card processing in place, according to IDQ. I have interviewed many, many companies, none can touch the rates of First Data.

YOU must be a member of **NESO** to get the best rate. You will also have **NO** monthly statement fee.

First Data is the processing, the equipment is much cheaper at **Merchantwarehouse.com**. The equipment at Merchant Warehouse is about \$259, but First Data will charge you about \$50 to send the programming to the machine. You will still save almost \$200 by buying it thru the warehouse. IF you have any questions about the First **Data program** call **Greg Allen 1-877-590-5838 ext 6521.** He is an excellent sales rep and can answer all of your questions. The unit that is the \$259 model is the **t7plus**.

One operator was upset after getting the unit, because it does not hook up to cable. This unit does have "dsl" capability, but uses a phone line to do so. If you do not want to use a phone line and you want to run over cable you will have to purchase a different unit. The phone line is used for 7-10 seconds for each transaction. This means you cannot be on the phone or receive phone calls during the transaction. Most stores elect to use the phone line, but if you only have one phone line you may want to consider the cable. This will add another monthly bill (cable bill). If you use an existing phone line, there will be no extra charge for using this phone line for the visa/MasterCard machine. One side note- at a recent DMA meeting one of our NESO Members reported sales thru the visa program for the month of Feb of \$4500. I can tell you my location had a similar experience. The average guest check for a VISA/MASTERCARD transaction is about \$10.00.

Some words on the Test Hotdog

IDQ has allowed North Lima Dairy Queen to be one of the 80 stores chosen for the all beef hotdog test. This test started Feb 1st, 2006 and will conclude on March 31st,2006.

I can only speak on the test at North Lima Dairy Queen and give my opinion of the situation. The hotdog test is a very passionate subject at our Dairy Queen. It is the one item, even though we are a full Brazier, that we sell the most units. This fact even surprised us, when we went back in to the summer of 2004. In the month of August 2004, our store sold over 5,000 all meat, **Fields crown select hotdogs**.

One of the reasons we checked units sold, was due to incoming competition. One mile down the road a new hotdog shop opened up, and we wanted to track our hotdogs on a daily basis to see if our hotdog sales would be affected by the new business. I knew we sold a lot of dogs, but I would have guessed more cones, burgers, and Blizzards, with hotdogs maybe in the top 12 items we sell. Hotdogs are easy to make and usually are ordered in multiples, so they are uneventful, just an every day part of the DQ.

When we tracked the hotdogs and discovered it is the single item we sell the most of in a day, we felt we must have a great product.

IDQ decided to have a test. Ours is a 10:1 all meat. We are testing a 10:1 all beef. We did a pre-survey which had mostly positives. A few commented on the bun, (could be toasted, or bigger...) but for the most part the hotdog was well liked.

Next, we put in the all beef hotdog, we still had some good comments, but the surveys became a lot more divided. The customer either seemed to love the hotdog or just hate it. The most important aspect is the numbers, each week we send a report by fax to IDQ on our sale of hotdogs, our food sales, and our total store sales. Mr. Rapp checks the percent of hotdogs sales to overall food sales and we have been steadily losing ground on this very important aspect of the test. The hotdog sales in our 4 weeks have dropped off by over 3 percentage points, which gives us cause for concern.

The decision to approve this hotdog will be made soon. This hotdog is also a more expensive hotdog, is directly tied to the beef market price fluctuations, and is very dark in color. When our test is completed I will give you a follow-up on our in store results.
